Independence Day commemorates the adoption of the Declaration of Independence - a day that recognized the United States' declaration of independence from the rule of Great Britain. Environmental Awareness*

Do you know how long it takes for a plastic bag to break down? According to the <u>Center for Biological</u> <u>Diversity</u>, it takes 1000 years and even then the breakdown isn't 'complete'. Forbes <u>adds more</u> to the discussion on plastics in the environment. But what about the bags you already have? Some stores have plastic bag recycling bins, food pantries and animal shelters may use them, and bags can be woven into sleeping mats (search 'weaving plastic bags' for tutorials). For future shopping, pull out those reusable bags that you get at every health fair and take them with you. (I keep them in the car.)

The Great Garbage Patch*

The <u>Great Pacific Garbage Patch</u> is what it sounds like. It's a trash vortex in the Pacific Ocean estimated to be at least 3 times the size of France. Look at the pictures that show the waste that has polluted the ocean. The Great Pacific Garbage Patch isn't the only oceanic garbage patch but <u>it's the biggest</u>.

What is Normal Aging?

How do we tell when our body is giving us a signal? Should we experience memory loss? Is it normal for our heart to skip a beat? We need to know what changes are normal and what changes need our attention. We experience sensory changes, changes in our skin, retrieval of information is slower, and our muscles and skeletal structures change. Mayo Clinic gives us some ideas on what we can expect as we age. Jefferson Health tells us what could be troublesome signs.

Substance Abuse and Older Adults*

"<u>Statistics on Seniors and Substance Abuse</u>" reports that in 2020, 167,200 people aged 55 or older were admitted to addiction treatment, up from 109,412 in 2009, and that alcohol is the substance that older adults 55+ seek treatment for most often, followed by heroin. <u>Different concerns</u> are raised for the older adult in regard to substances as metabolism slows and other health issues are considerations. Substance abuse may be confused with other signs of aging or with <u>other chronic health issues</u>.

This Just In - Another Alzheimer's Drug Approved by FDA

Kisunla (donanemab) from Eli Lilly is the <u>second treatment available in the United States</u> for Alzheimer's after trials show the drug to "modestly slow a decline in memory and thinking abilities". Kisunla is a monoclonal antibody infusion given every 4 weeks for those with mild cognitive impairment or those in the early stages of Alzheimer's disease. <u>Read more about Kisunla</u>, treatment, and costs. Like other







drugs in its class, it comes with possible side effects of brain swelling and brain bleeds. Lilly indicates that there will be Medicare coverage for those beneficiaries who meet the guidelines.

Refresher on Leqembi – The Second Approved Treatment*

Leqembi was approved in 2023 and will cost Medicare an estimated \$3.5 Billion next year according to an AARP Bulletin article (June 2024 Vol 65 No 5) "Health Care Update: Alzheimer's Drug Costly to Medicare". Leqembi is administered intravenously in a doctor's office or other outpatient setting so it is covered by Part B of Medicare rather than through Part D prescription drug coverage. The cost is estimated at \$26,500 per year (lower than previous estimates) and out-of-pocket costs will vary depending on the beneficiary's insurance coverage. Certain requirements must be met to qualify for coverage:

- Diagnosis of mild cognitive impairment and documented report of beta-amyloid plaque on the brain
- Use a physician who participates in the qualifying registry with a clinical team and follow-up care.

Alzheimer's Medications

There are risks and benefits according to the experts who continue to work diligently to find treatments, and hopefully, cures for Alzheimer's disease. Alzheimer's is complex. As more causes of dementia come to light with improved diagnostics, experts have found that one drug does not fit all. Some medications benefit one condition but have serious consequences for others. Some medications address behavioral aspects of Alzheimer's disease while the two most-recently approved medications target halting the disease. Talk to your primary care provider and/ or your neurologist about medication options.

Health Care Decision Making

Have you legally designated someone to act in your behalf on medical decisions if you are unable to speak for yourself? Life can change in a heartbeat and that's not just for older adults. Read about Advanced Directives. If you are of legal age, consider completing a Medical Power of Attorney. Do the research. Choose the person who will follow your wishes.
