Music & Memory II*

There is so much information available on music and memory, and music can be used in so many applications. Check out "<u>A Mind Roused by Music</u>" on YouTube which was the introduction to music and memory for many. The story of Henry is so impactful. Alan Harvey, musician and neurologist, offers "<u>Your brain on music</u>" in a TEDxPerth video. Talk to your loved ones about their favorite music. Music is an inexpensive caregiving tool and there are so many resources for all types of music. Think about how music can help care receivers at home or in a facility!

Alien Hand Syndrome or Alien Limb Syndrome

First described in 1908, alien hand syndrome can result from brain damage due to surgery, brain tumors, aneurysms, stroke, neurodegenerative disease, or trauma. Sometimes a specific cause is not identified. This can occur in the legs as well. Disruptions in brain networks that involve movement cause the limbs to act as if they have a mind of their own. <u>Brain & Life</u> explores the problem in "What is Alien Hand Syndrome?" and You Tube offers a <u>2-minute video explanation</u>.

Alzheimer's & Dementia News*

Research has been on-going for those with dementia but progress has been slow. <u>Medications</u> for symptom control have been on the market for some time. There is still no cure. In addition to a few





<u>new medications such as Leqembi</u>, there is also information on <u>gamma light intervention</u> from MIT. WVU's Blanchette Rockefeller Neurosciences Institute continues to work on dementia interventions researching <u>how to "cross" the blood-brain barrier</u>. Not all medications are effective for all dementias. Not all medications are safe for all dementias such as the use of Haldol and other antipsychotics with Lewy Body Disease. Consult your neurologist for medication information.
